

CACHE Level 2 Certificate in Principles of End of Life Care (QCF 13 Credits)

What are the specific details?

Duration	You have up to eight weeks to complete the course.
Venue	Run via distance learning and can therefore be fitted around work and personal life.
Cost	Free (fully government funded)*.

This qualification is aimed at learners seeking to increase their knowledge of end of life care in a vocational setting. It is aimed at those working in the healthcare sector whose job role includes caring for those who have a life-limiting illness.

Who is this course suitable for?

An ideal qualification for those seeking to increase their knowledge and understanding of end of life care in a vocational context. This includes a wide range of people working in healthcare whose job description includes caring for those who have a life limiting illness.

Do I need any experience?

Learners are required to undertake the following units:

- Unit 1 Understand how to work in the end of life care
- Unit 2 Care planning in end of life care
- Unit 3 Understand how to provide support to manage pain and discomfort
- Unit 4 End of life care and dementia
- Unit 5 Understand the role of the care worker in time of death
- Unit 6 Understand loss and grief in end of life care

*Learners must be 19 years+ and have lived in the UK/EU for 3 years.
